

Internal audit is the periodic independent review of a council's internal controls resulting in an assurance report designed to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the activities and operating procedures under the council's control. Managing the council's internal controls should be a day-to-day function of the council through its staff and management and not left for internal audit. It would be incorrect to view internal audit as the detailed inspection of all records and transactions of a council in order to detect error or fraud. This report is based on the evidence made available to me and consequently the report is limited to those matters set out below.

The council is required to take appropriate action on all matters raised in reports from internal and external audit and to respond to matters brought to its attention by internal and external audit. Failure to take appropriate action may lead to a qualified audit opinion.

To the Chairman of the Council:

Thank you very much for sending documentation as requested enabling me to conduct the Internal Audit for the Parish Council remotely, due to the Covid 19 pandemic.

I examined Book Keeping, Due Process, Risk Management, Bank Reconciliations, Internal Control, Year-End Procedures and performed a detailed scan of the minutes via the website. I also sought evidence that previous Audit Reports have been actioned.

I draw your attention to the following comments:

- It is very disappointing to note that despite having raised the out-of-date website on my two previous Annual Internal Audit Reports, the matter is still not resolved. I would suggest that during a pandemic, residents of Denton should have been able to view the activities of the Parish Council and that the website should have been a focal point of information as well as displaying transparency. The website is still not active, the last Minutes I can find published on the old website are dated March 2019. I realise the Council have now approved a 2Commune website but I am disappointed to have to raise this for a third year
- Minutes references 35/20, 72/20 & 81/20 all refer to a process by which the Parish Council is looking to go out to tender to repair the Churchyard wall. I would draw your attention to the Parish Council Financial Regulations. The most up to date publication of 2019, by which the Council should be operating under, clearly state the process for procurement. The Minutes published show various names of contractors who may or may not, be awarded the contract and I would suggest this is very poor practise and commercially sensitive information. Any procurement projects the Council wishes to pursue must adhere to due process; this process mismanaged, could be subject to legal challenge.

I was pleased to note the publication of the Exercise of Publics Rights this year and that the Council has carried out a process of Internal Control. I note the Clerk, Mrs Clarke, is leaving her position and would like to thank her for her support in achieving the Internal Audits over the last few years. I wish her all the very best in her next "chapter".

I wish the Parish Council a successful and safe 2021/2022 and look forward to returning to complete the Annual Internal Audit next year.
